Warren in 1855, with 1680 Overlay of Solomon Keyes Sr. First Grant

This map shows the town of Warren in 1855 with the overlay flipped up. The town of Warren was originally called Western. Very detailed, this map labels roads, family houses, businesses, rivers (including the Quaboug River), ponds, public locations, and surrounding towns. When you flip down the overlay you will see a red line. This red line represents the original greater Brookfield boundary before the town of Warren seceded from Brookfield in 1701. The bright orange shaded area labels the grant of Solomon Keyes (Robert Wilder's ancestor nine generations before) received in 1680. This grant included approximately 1,880 acres. The little white dot in the middle of the orange-labeled chunk was Solomon Keyes's house.

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
