Military Hi-Way Thru Elm Hill Farm to Devil's Elbow Road – 1673

Map number 39 demonstrates the Military Hi-Way. The military hi-way was constructed in 1673 to give the troops a faster and more efficient route to get from Boston to the frontier (*Labeled in red*). The Military Hi-Way was also referred to as Elm Hill Farm Road or the New Bay Path. The military hi-way leads into Devil's Elbow Road after crossing Brookfield Road on the West side of the map. Also labeled on this map are various early roads such as Buxton Road of 1717 and East Main Street of Brookfield also known as the Post Road of 1763. Lastly this map names the people that lived off of these roads as well as the location of their settlements.

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
