Map 52

3 Room House & its Development From Early 1700's -1830.

Map 52 illustrates the layout of a typical house between the 1700's and 1830. Also shown

is the development of a house over time. With the overlays flipped up you will find the

base. This consisted of 3 rooms that a young man would construct once he is getting

married. This house had basic features such as 3 hearths, an oven, a cupboard and storage

under the stairs. You will notice the well is located out doors, and also the dump is

located just out the back window. This is where the family threw their trash. With one

overlay down the house has now increased with size. When the family grows, there is a

need for more living space. New rooms including a utility room and wood shed are

introduced. You will notice the well is located indoors. This allows for access of water

much easier, especially with harsh weather conditions. With the overlays flipped down

there is another addition. Now shown is a 5-room cape. The 5-room cape includes

another bedroom and closets. Now homeowners started plastering garrets for bedrooms

upstairs. In Brookfield there is one remaining 3-room house located on Route 9 and Mill

Street junction.
