Greater Brookfield's Second Beginning 1686-1692

This map demonstrates the development of Brookfield. A component of this map is the

overlay that denotes the original plantation and the original town boundary lines. The

overlay shows the original location of North Brookfield, Fast Brookfield, Brookfield,

West Brookfield and Western (Warren). It also shows various Indian tribes and the

original town boundary, which is a six-mile square or 36 square mile grant given in 1660.

Underneath the overlay it is obvious that the town's boundary lines expanded

significantly from showing the First settlement of six square miles on the overlay to the

Second settlement of eight square miles, settled in 1673. A distinct element to this map is

the showing of the locations, names of residence and dates where residents were once

settled. Also shows the location of the roads, including New Bay Path (1673); the

boundary lines separating the First Parish, Second Parish, Third Parish and East Village;

and later to be added is 500 Acres in 1717, Western in 1741, part of Ware in June 1750

and part of New Braintree in 1750.

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
